

300 YEARS OF GRAND LODGE

The first Minute book of Grand Lodge dates from 1723 and so, for an earlier history of Grand Lodge, it is necessary to rely on the "Constitutions" of 1723 compiled and written by Dr James Anderson and which he updated in his "New Book of Constitutions" in 1738. Dr Anderson describes the steps taken, after the 1715 Jacobite rising, by four old London Lodges to establish themselves under a Grand Master so that the custom of holding regular meetings of all the Lodges' Officers could be revived.

".....the four Lodges of London thought fit to cement together under a Grand Master....viz. the Lodges that met,

- 1. At the Goose and Gridiron Ale-house in St Paul's Church-Yard.
- 2. At the Crown Ale-house in Parker's Lane near Drury Lane.
- 3. At the Apple-Tree Tavern in Charles Street, Covent-Garden.
- 4. At the Rummer and Grapes Tavern in Channel Row, Westminster.

They and some old Brothers met at the said Apple-Tree, and having put into the Chair the oldest Master Mason.....they constituted themselves a Grand Lodge pro Tempore in Due Form, and...

...resolv'd to hold the Annual Assembly and Feast, and then to chuse a Grand Master from among themselves, till they should have the Honour of a Noble Brother at their Head."

On St John Baptists' Day, the 24 June 1717, the Assembly and Feast of the Free and Accepted Masons was held at the Goose and Gridiron Alehouse in St Paul's Churchyard.

Thus came into being the very first Grand Lodge.

Of the four Lodges that had formed themselves into the first Grand Lodge No 2 above, that which met at the Crown Alehouse, lapsed in about 1736. The other three have continued either, as in the case of No 1 above, by preserving their identity intact (No 1 becoming the Lodge of Antiquity No 2) or by amalgamating, the Lodge of Fortitude and Old Cumberland No 12 (the original No 3 above) and the Royal Somerset House and Inverness Lodge No 4 (the original No 4 above).





WHAT IS MASONRY?

A Lodge had organised a camping trip and, one night when it was cold, the members built a campfire. Sitting around the fire they started to discuss the fraternity and its teachings. After having listened patiently to all the thoughts and ideas being expressed one senior member of the Lodge finally spoke up.

"I can tell you more about Masonry by a little example than all the great Masonic philosophers can in all their writings. Everybody, stand up and gather in a circle around and facing the fire."

This they did.

"Now, everybody hold hands with the man next to him." $\,$

They did this too.

"Now, what do you see when you look ahead?"

"The face of a Brother through the light of the flames."

"What do you feel in front of you?"

"The warmth of the fire and the comfort it brings?"

"What do you feel at your side?"

"The friendly hand of a Brother."

"Now drop your hands and turn around."

They all did so.

"Now what do you see when you look ahead?"

"Complete darkness."

"What do you feel in front of you?"

"A sense of being alone in the dark."


"What do you feel at your side?"

"Nothing at all."

"What do you feel behind you?"

"The warmth of the fire."

"So it is with Masonry," said the senior member of the Lodge "In Masonic gatherings you can feel the warmth of Masonic interaction; you can see the face of a Brother through the light that Masonry brings to you; and you can always feel the warm hand of your Masonic Brother. When you turn away from Masonry, and are out in the world, you see darkness, you do not feel the warm hand of your Masonic Brother and could feel alone. But Masonry, and the light it brings, are just a turn away."



He was sent home to England as a boy to be educated and proved himself to be an excellent student. Unhappy at being parted from his parents for so long, he was delighted to return to India to live and started working for a newspaper where not only wrote most of the copy, but also operated the printing press. Kipling was a devoted Freemason who readily acknowledged his Masonic affiliations in verse; his writings containing many allusions and references to the Masonic experience. He shared that particular bond we have with the Lodge into which we were initiated. He loved his brethren, regardless of race, colour or creed, and this comes across so dramatically in his poem entitled 'The Mother Lodge' in which he describes some of the brethren within the Hope and Perseverance Lodge, which was his 'Mother Lodge'. These are the first three verses: -


There was Rundle, Station Master. An' Beazley of the Rail, An' Ackman, Commissariat, An' Donkin o' the jail; An' Blake, Conductor-Sargent, Our Master twice was 'e, With 'im that kept the Europe shop, Old Franjee Eduljee.

Outside - "Sergeant! Sir! Salute! Salaam!"
Inside - "Brother," an it doesn't do no 'arm;
We meet upon the level an' we parted on the Square,
An' I was Junior Deacon in my Mother Lodge out there!

We'd Bola Nath, Accountant. An' Saul, the Aden Jew,
An' Din Mahammed, draughtsman of the Survey Office, too;
There was Babu Chuckerbutty, An' Amir Singh the Sikh,
An' Castro from the fittin'-sheds, the Roman Catholic.

He was initiated in Hope and Perseverance Lodge No. 782 at Lahore, Punjab, in 1886. It was an English Constitution Lodge and special dispensation was required because he was under twenty one years of age at the time. The same evening that he was raised, he was elected Secretary of his Lodge and so recorded his own initiation in the minutes of the Lodge. A few months later, he delivered a lecture to his Brethren on the origin of the Masonic First Degree.

We find out a little more about Kipling, the Freemason, from the letters he wrote: "I was made a Freemason by dispensation (being under age) because the Lodge hoped for a good Secretary. They did not get him, but I helped". And in another; "I was Secretary for some years of my Lodge which included Brethren of at least four different creeds. I was entered by a member of the Brahmo Samaj (a Hindu), passed by a Mohammedan, and raised by an Englishman. Our Tyler was an Indian Jew. We met, of course, on the level, and the only difference anyone would notice was that at our banquets, some of the Brethren, who were debarred by caste from eating food not ceremonially prepared, sat over empty plates." In his poems, Kipling was the master of every metre and all verse forms. The following is just two of the verses of his poem, 'Banquet Night', a poem which refers both to the building of King Solomon's Temple (a central theme in Masonic ritual) and also the degree of a Fellow-Craft Freemason: -



"Once in so often," King Solomon said,
Watching his quarrymen drill the stone,
"We will club our garlic and wine and bread,
And banquet together beneath my Throne.
And all the Brethren shall come to that mess,
As Fellow-Craftsmen - no more and no less.

"Carry this message to Hiram Abif,
Excellent master of forge and mine,
I and the Brethren would like it
If he and the Brethren will come to dine
(Garments from Bozrah or morning-dress),
As Fellow-Craftsmen - no more and no less."

Kipling was, for many, the most accomplished of all English poets, writing such well-loved poems as 'Mandalay' and 'Gunga Din', and 'If' must be one of the greatest poems ever written. His genius was not restricted to writing poetry; many of his novels are accepted classics. In one of these, entitled 'The Man who would be King', the heroes are a pair of British ex soldiers whose adventures are centred on their being Freemasons. He is regarded as a major "innovator in the art of the short story"; and his children's books, such as 'The Jungle Book', are enduring classics of children's literature. Kipling wrote his autobiography, 'Something of Myself for my Friends Known and Unknown', in 1935. However, he was ill at the time and finally passed away the next year at the age of 71 years.



FOR GIRLS


AT RICKMANSWORTH PARK SINCE 1934

The School became an open fee paying school in 1978 and accepts girls from all backgrounds and faiths. The majority of families associated with the School have no links with Freemasonry, with our name now largely being a reference to our past. RMS is one of the oldest girls' schools in the country.

Founded by Chevalier Ruspini in 1788, the School's original purpose was to educate the daughters of Freemasons who were unable to support their families through death, illness or disability. The School started with fifteen pupils and a matron in Somers Place in East London and moved twice within London until it finally settled in the magnificent grounds of Rickmansworth Park in 1934.

With 200 acres of stunning grounds, Rickmansworth Park once surrounded a stately home. The School was purpose built on its site, making the most of its generous land. With over 3000 trees, rolling grassland and exceptional facilities, the staff and students are indeed blessed to live and work in such a beautiful place.

When the School was designed, the size, scale and quality of the buildings was generous to a fault; come and visit the acoustically magnificent chapel with its organ and delicate frescoes, the impressive Great Hall and the Dining Hall with its exquisite cameos of deer, rabbits and plants. The Garth is home to the boarding houses and our well equipped Resource Centre and beyond is our state of the art Sports and Fitness Centre. But it is not just about buildings; we are a school which embraces its traditions while looking forward to the future.



£2M IN LESS THAN 2 YEARS


This meant they used the event to celebrate the Tercentenary and make both Masons and non-Masons alike aware of the 300 years of Freemasonry in England.




